PROPHESY #14: The Roman Empire

The Roman empire was considered the greatest empire in terms of territory possessed and duration of political power. (1700 years). Jerusalem and Israel came under Roman rule in

63 BC. It was the habit of the Romans to take thousands into slavery and to impose a rigid government on those that they conquered. (Daniel 2:40) Jesus was born during this Roman oppression.

Previously in our study, we read in Daniels prophesy that Christ (the rock) would smash all empires in history. (Daniel 2:34-35). The rock represents Christ at his Seconding Coming to earth. But, before Christ's Second Coming occurs, several prophesies concerning Rome must be fulfilled.

1. A future global Roman Kingdom will be established that will "crush" its victims. It will be ruled by ten Roman kings. These are represented in scripture as the "ten horns". (Daniel 7:19-20a)

2. A future Roman leader will arise (the Anti-Christ) and defeat three of the kings. He is represented in the prophesy as "another horn". (Daniel 7:206) The Anti-Christ will speak "boastfully".

3. The Anti-Christ will "wage war" against the saints (Believers) and defeat them." (Daniel 7:21) This is during the Great Tribulation, when both Jewish and Christian Believers are persecuted and martyred. The Anti-Christ will speak against God and try to replace Him. The Anti-Christ will try to change the laws (including forcing people to get the "mark of the Beast" in order to buy or sell things.) The Anti-Christ will rule for 3 1/2 years. (Daniel 7:25) (Revelation 13:16-17)

The final stage of the Roman Empire (which will be destroyed at the Second Coming of Christ) has not been fulfilled <u>yet</u>.
