
We must know and understand that God has great things planned for those who love Him and serve Him. We don't need to live in fear, even in those times we may not understand God's ways.



FRIENDSHIP FUDGE

- 3 cups (18 oz) semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 (14 oz) can condensed milk
- dash salt
- ½ - 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 ½ tsp. vanilla

In heavy saucepan, over low heat, melt chocolate chips, condensed milk and salt, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, stir in nuts and vanilla. Cover bottom of 9" square pan with wax paper. Pour in fudge. Chill until firm. Remove from pan. Cut into 1" squares. Makes 2# of fudge.



Your Obituary Has Not Yet Been Written

Toward the end of the nineteenth century, Swedish chemist Alfred Nobel awoke one morning to read his own obituary in the local newspaper:



“Alfred Nobel, the inventor of dynamite, who died yesterday, devised a way for more people to be killed in a war than ever before, and he died a very rich man.”

Actually, it was Alfred’s older brother who had died; a newspaper reporter had bungled the epitaph. But the account had a profound effect on Nobel. He decided he wanted to be known for something other than developing the means to kill people efficiently and for amassing a fortune in the process. So he initiated the Nobel Prize, the award for scientists and writers who foster peace. Today he is more widely known for the Nobel Peace Prize than he is for inventing dynamite. Nobel is quoted as saying, “Every man ought to have the chance to correct his epitaph in midstream and write a new one.”

As I read this quote, I was hit with a very arresting thought: My obituary has not yet been written. Whatever it is that men think of me, I still have the opportunity to make it better. Whatever mistakes I have made in the past, the possibility still exists for me to correct them. Whatever it is that I have yet not done, but should have, I still have time. As long as God gives me life and liberty, I can make of it something meaningful and lasting. As long as I have breath and desire, I can do my part to improve myself, my family, my neighborhood, the church, even the world.

Everyone still has the opportunity to correct his epitaph, up until the day he dies. Of course, the best thing that could ever be written in our obituary is that we were a faithful Christian. And certainly there are many wonderful things we can add to that. And if you awoke this morning and are able to read this, there’s still time to make sure that is the case.

“Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is” (Eph. 5:15-17, ESV).

Where did he go? He's not behind me. He's not on the path. I called. He did not come. I retraced my steps, and kept looking into the old orchard. (We walked past the old orchard every day.)

Finally. There he was, a distance into the old orchard. I called. He did not come. he was "nose to the ground", and not paying any attention. Branches from the old trees had broken from the tree trunks and fallen to the ground. It was not easy going.

"Dudley! Dudley! Come here!" He looked up.

"Come on, Dud," I shouted as I continued deeper into the orchard.

"Who's a good boy? Look what I have. Do you want a treat?"

Silly question... he began trotting back toward me.

Why had he strayed? I Looked around. Oh, that's why...

The edge of the old orchard looked different. It used to have tall weeds and broken limbs. Those things were gone. But, the real difference was that a big item (which had been there for years) was missing. It was my first car (a 1970 Ford Mustang). It had been dragged from the edge of the old orchard, and loaded onto a flat-bed truck that was headed to the recycling facility.

That's it! Dudley had been exploring new territory. (Places where he had not been before.) He had never squeezed past the parked car before.

Dudley has had a number of new things happen this month. First, there was the new snow. Yes, Dudley has seen snow before, but he never quite knew when it would arrive. When it did arrive, it was always a surprise.

"What's that white stuff? What do I do with it?" I can't carry it... and if I take it into my mouth, it just disappears."

Then, there was that new thing in the front window of our house. "It blocked my view as I sat on the back of the loveseat.

Later, the strangest thing happened after dark. The thing became covered with small colored dots that lit up. I hope it doesn't stay there long."

"Then, there are the new shiny bags with handles on top. Something different was put into each one. I could almost see what the things were, but then they were quickly covered with something called 'tissue paper.' I would like to pull it out and chew on it, but the bags have been placed out of my reach."

Dudley usually adapts well to new things. First, he will stand back and observe for a while. Then he will move closer. He knows he is safe if he is with his master. Similarly, we are safe if we are with Our Master. He will lead us into a new year and be there for us when we need Him.

God calls us to change... to embrace that which is holy. if someone has not accepted Jesus as Savior, God wants to give that person His gift. God also has a gift for Christians. It's called "growth" or "maturity" in their faith. But... what must Christians change in order to grow and mature? At least four things: 1. our heart, 2. our thoughts, 3. our words, and 4. our behavior.

1. CHANGE OUR HEART

Maturing in our faith is an on-going process. The psalmist asked God to create in him a “pure heart” and to renew a “steadfast spirit” within him. (Psalms 51:10) Our ‘heart’ represents our character. If a person does not have a pure heart, that person will be less like God. When the psalmist asked for a “steadfast spirit”, he was asking for renewal of his spirit when he failed to keep his heart pure. Ask. God will change your heart. (Ezekiel 36:26),

2. CHANGE OUR THOUGHTS

Our thoughts mature with us as we age. That does not mean that we become better people as we age. It means that a child will sin in personal thoughts that are child-like. For example: “I hate Ethan because he has a bike.” But, an adult will sin in personal thoughts that are adult-like. For example: “I gate Joe. He got the promotion that I deserved.”

When we seriously accept Christ into our lives, we may have to stop ourselves if a sinful thought enters our mind. Because, if someone accepts Christ... “he is a, ‘new creation:’ the old has gone, the new has come.” (2 Corinthians 5:17)

Mature, Christians should pray that their words and their thoughts be pleasing to God. (Psalm 19:14)

3. CHANGE OUR WORDS

How do we know if our words are acceptable to God? One way is to consult the Bible. For example, it says that we should not take the name of the Lord in vain. (Exodus 20:7) That means, don’t say, “Oh God!” or “Jesus Christ!” unless you are praying reverently. A person’s words reflect what is in his heart. (no matter what age he is.) Christians should set an example in words... faith and purity. (1 Timothy 4:12)

4. CHANGE OUR BEHAVIOR

The Bible says that humans have an “Earthly nature”. This is the opposite of the holy nature of God. Our “earthly” nature” includes behaviors such as impurity, sexual immorality, and greed. (Ephesians 5:3). Why should we change them? Because they, “are improper for God’s holy people.” There also should not be obscenity, foolish talk, or course joking coming from our mouths. (Ephesians 5:4)

As we begin the new year, let us embrace our Lord’s plans for His followers. Let us change what is needed in our hearts, our thoughts, our words, and our behaviors. Let us become more like our Master.
