


UMW NEWS



CUTIE PIES

- 1 Pkg. Yellow cake mix
- 1 cup cold milk
- 1 (4serving size) pkg. Jello Vanilla Flavor Instant Pudding & Pie Filling
- 1 1/2 cups Cool Whip
- 4 squares Baker's Semi-sweet Baking Chocolate

Preheat oven to 350° .

Prepare cake batter and bake in 24 greased medium cups as directed on package for cupcakes. Cool 10 minutes in pan, remove to wire racks.

Pour milk in a large bowl, add dry pudding mix. Beat with a wire whisk 2 minutes or until well blended, Let Stand 5 minutes to thicken. Meanwhile, using a serrated knife, cut cupcakes horizontally in half. Gently stir 1/2 cup Cool Whip into the pudding mix. Spoon about 1 tablespoon of the pudding mixture onto the bottom half of each cupcake. Cover with top of cupcake. Melt chocolate squares to make frosting or buy a can of chocolate frosting (EASY WAY!).
