

The Cuba Council of Churches met January 12 with Faith Stewart presiding. It was reported that the Holiday Assistance Program went smoothly with \$30 gift certificates for either Family Dollar or Cuba Pharmacy Gift Nook given to 241 Cuba-Rushford children. 107 families also received \$25 gift certificates to Giant as well as a bag of groceries from the Community Food Churches Pantry. Pastor Megan Cusumano and Pastor Stan Scoville was co-chairs of the Holiday Assis-

tance. Our church was also represented by Fred Pearce who helped with the distribution. The Community Food Pantry is now depleted and in special need of jarred sauces, box dinners, canned meats and cereal.

In December there were five requests for assistance from the Food Pantry: 4 grocery voucher requests and one for gas.

The Council reviewed the very successful Dessert Buffet held last year on Fat Tuesday at Cuba United Methodist Church. Nearly 100 people from all five Cuba churches attended the event which featured music by Chorduroy. This year the event will be held at North Park Wesleyan on Tuesday, February 9 at 6pm. Prophesy #2: Salvation and Spiritual Warfare

After the sin of Adam and Eve, God did not abandon mankind to only a difficult life followed by death. He had a plan for future fellowship with him.

God's first act was to curse Satan who, in the form of a serpent, had tempted Eve. (Genesis 3:14) Satan, like God, was a spiritual being. He existed before the creation of earth, just like God's holy angels did. But Satan was rebellious and desired to be worshipped as God (Isaiah 14:12-14) He is still working in this world to achieve that goal. This is called Spiritual Warfare. (Ephesians 6:11-12) So, God gives prophesy that Spiritual Warfare will continue on earth until Christ comes again.

God spoke to Stan who was in the form of a serpent, (in the Garden). God said that there would be hatred between Eve (and her offspring) against Satan (and his followers.) God next said that Satan would strike also at his son Jesus. But, Jesus, the Christ, would ultimately crush Satan just like a snake's head is crushed to kill it. (Genesis 3:15)

After the sin of Adam and Eve, God shed blood of animals in order to have skins to cover Adam and Eve's nakedness. (Genesis 3:21. This mirrored the future shedding of Jesus' blood for our forgiveness and salvation. (Ephesians 1:7) Thus came the phrases, "covered by the blood," and "washed in the blood."

So, God showed the prophesy of Salvation with Jesus' coming and dying. And, the prophesy of Spiritual Warfare continuing. These pronouncements were literal. And, these pronouncements came true.

Prophesy #3: The Flood

After Adam and Eve were expelled from the Garden, they toiled and they had children. After many generations, mankind had become increasingly wicked. (Genesis 6:5-6) So, God made a decision: He would wipe out everything he had created, including mankind and animals. (Genesis 6:7) But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord." (v.6) He and his family would be saved.

Why did Noah find favor? He was "righteous" and "blameless" and "walked with God". (Genesis 6:8-9) And God told Noah His plans. Noah was to build an ark (a huge vessel that would float.) God gave specific instructions and measurements. (Genesis 6:14-16)

Noah followed God's instructions and took his family and pairs of animals into the ark. The entire earth was covered with water and it did not recede until the tenth month. (Genesis 8:5) When Noah and his family were able to exit the ark, the immediately worshiped God.

Then God made a covenant with Noah and Noah's descendants, and with all living creatures. God would never again end all life with a flood. And, never again would there be a flood to destroy the earth. (Genesis 9:11) As a sign of the covenant, God promised (made a prophesy) that there would be a rainbow in the sky after rain fell. (Genesis 9:12-17)

God's pronouncements of a flood and of a rainbow were literal. And, these pronouncements came true.

WHY ASH WEDNESDAY?

Traditionally, the Christian church has observed the seven weeks before Easter as a time of penitence and spiritual self-examination.

Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent, derives its names from the ancient practice of marking the foreheads of worship-

pers with ashes from the unused palm branches of the previous year. Ashes historically have had a dual significance.

First, they are Old testament symbols of sadness and humility. Job, in the midst of all his troubles, cried out to God from the ash heap.

The second symbolic meaning of ashes is as a reminder of our mortality. Each of us faces the inevitability of physical death. Our bodies and material possessions eventually will turn to dust and ashes. This is a reminder that we dare not trust in things that crumble.

But Lent does not leave us on the ash heap. It begins with Ash Wednesday, but ends with Easer. And Easter proclaims that, through Christ, God resurrects us from our dust and ashes, makes us new creatures, and brings life out of death!




God's Valentine gift of love to us Was not a bunch of flowers; It wasn't candy, or a book To while away the hours.

His gift was to become a man, So He could freely give His sacrificial love for us, So you and I could live.


He gave us sweet salvation, and Instruction, good and true--To love our friends and enemies And love our Savior, too.
