

## Pastor Sunny's Rays

What a beautiful sun shiny day! I love the sun. Things start to turn green and flowers and trees come into bloom with color and life. Isn't it wonderful how God set this world up to work together to bring about that beauty and new life? It's a unity in nature so to speak.

Which reminds me of Psalms 133:1-3:

*"How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in unity! It is like precious oil poured on the head, running down the beard, running down on Aaron's beard, down upon the collar of his robes. It is as if the dew of Hermon were falling on Mount Zion. For the Lord bestows his blessing, even life evermore."*

The Lord says 3 things here.

1. If we dwell together in unity....He will send the:
2. the precious ointment. the anointing: then
3. God commanded the blessing

God says that if we will dwell in unity, that it is like the ointment upon the head that ran down Aaron's beard. The ointment is the anointing. Unity will bring anointing. So let's back up a little. What does it take to bring unity?


Unity only comes by the Spirit. Let's face it, we all have different ideas of what we want or would like to see. These are our human desires. Everyone has an opinion. When God desires something it would be rather insane to say that in a group that are dwelling together that He would tell each one to go a different direction. God is not the author of confusion. Every one going in a different direction, seeing issues from only one perspective will promote disharmony and confusion. If every person desires only the will of the Holy Spirit, then God would give each a similar direction or desire. Unity comes by the Spirit.

Going backwards a little more, then the question is, "how do we get into the spirit and hear His voice?" First we need to get to the point that we desire HIM first and foremost. We want His will more than our own. Our will and agenda we have learned are fruitless and are just dead religious works. The Holy Spirit says: "if you want me, I'll come, if you will praise me, I'll come". For me personally, I have found that the best way is to spend time with the Lord. I have learned to praise and worship Him no matter what. God inhabits praise. I have learned that spending time praying will bring me into the spirit and out of myself. I cannot leave without mention of two very important ladies; Shirley Pugh was our accompanist for many years until she retired and moved away. She was a wonderful lady and the choir and I were so fortunate to have her accompany. I was especially fortunate, as she many times carried the choir with her amazing accompaniment during my green years.

Likewise we were so fortunate to have Joyce Enderle follow Shirley. With that transition we didn't miss a beat. Joyce accompanied the choir for many years until she felt she could no longer do justice to the music. But even at what she thought was her low point she was still a marvelous accompanist.

Today's choir also has many loyal and self-less members who I cannot leave out in my farewell address. Thank you to our bass section, which also includes Marshall Allen, & Paul Tsujimoto along with before mentioned Gary. Our tenors I already mentioned in the lifelong choir, Dave and Karl, with Wally as switch hitter, singing either bass or tenor where ever needed. Donna Lawton, and Shirley Mosher hold down the alto section with Maggie, while Pastor Sunny, Jean Bowers, and Judy Hughs help Deb and Phyllis fill the air with soprano sounds. This year we have several of our youth singing with us, I do hope they are able to continue, Jasmyn Dorsey, Joshua Tsujimoto, and Joseph Hughes. (Lord help me if I forgot someone, if I did it just proves my time has come!)

Thank you all for your support of the choir over the years. I truly hope this tradition will continue in some form or another in our church.

Going backwards some more is that we must be filled with the Spirit. Unless we are filled, the only thing that we can draw from is the world around us, which is not always pleasing to God. ## LENTEN LUNCHES








## ELECTION DAY DINNER
