A coin would roll down and go plink plop clang down the hot air furnace grate in front of the pulpit while their dad was preaching. Both boys eventually became ordained ministers."

We will explore, learn, and fellowship together as we visit Caesarea, the Sea of Galilee, Cana, Nazareth, Samaria, Jacob's Well, the Dead Sea, Bethlehem, Jerusalem and much more.
