

KNOWING JESUS AS THE GOOD SHEPHERD & SHARING THE RISEN CHRIST WITH ALL.



But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. Hebrews 11:6

One of my favorite passages of Scripture is Hebrews 11 because it tells us about the "heroes of faith"—the people throughout the Bible who did amazing exploits for God. I have read Hebrews 11 many times, but one day I noticed a pattern. All the heroes listed in that chapter **heard** God, **believed** God, and **obeyed** God. Noah heard God tell him to build an ark, he believed God, obeyed Him, and saved his household. Moses followed the same pattern when God told him to take the children of Israel out of Egypt. And when Joshua heard, believed, and obeyed God's instruction to march around Jericho seven times and shout, the walls came tumbling down.

Many people who grew up in church remember being told to hear and obey. But they are leaving a step out. We may hear God, but if we don't believe what we've heard, we won't obey. Biblical faith is believing what God says no matter what people, our feelings, or our circumstances tell us. The good news is we can follow the pattern outlined in Hebrews 11 today! We can hear God every day because He has sent the Holy Spirit to speak to us, guide us into all truth (John 16:13), and tell us what God wants us to do. And there is more good news! If we hear and believe Him, He gives us the power to obey Him—to do what He told us to do—even if it seems impossible.

Acts 1:8 says, "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." The Holy Spirit gives us power not only to witness to other people about Jesus but also to do what He says. When we obey God and He shows up to do signs, wonders, and miracles through our lives, it makes us want to follow Jesus even more and become even greater disciples.

I don't know about you, but I would have wanted to be one of those heroes of faith. What if God was writing a faith chapter today in the books He keeps in heaven? Would you make it in? What do you think it would take to become a hero of faith? Follow the examples of Jesus' disciples and the heroes of faith, and hear, believe, and obey God every day. When you become a follower, you have the power to change the world for Jesus Christ!

Prayer

Father, thank You for sending the Holy Spirit so He might guide me into all truth. Today, I choose to hear what You are saying, believe You, and obey You so I might be transformed into the image of Jesus Christ and become one of His followers. Please give me the grace and power to do Your will. In Jesus' name, Amen.



LEMON GRAHAM FREEZE Cindy Dutton

(5 oz) can evaporated milk
 ¹/₂ cup sugar
 TBS lemon juice
 6 whole graham crackers



Pour milk in large metal mixing bowl. Add beaters to bowl and freeze for 30 minutes until soft crystals form around edge of bowl. Using cold beaters, beat milk until soft peaks form. Gradually add sugar and lemon juice. Mix well. Place 5 graham crackers in ungreased 11" x 7" x2" dish. Pour milk mixture over crackers. Crush remaining graham crackers and sprinkle on top. Cover and freeze until firm. Yield: 6 cool and refreshing servings!



Spiritual Warfare: Jesus



June 2018

When Jesus lived on earth, everything did not go perfectly. As a matter of fact, He was fighting spiritual warfare with Satan just after He was baptized and spent forty days alone, fasting in the desert.

Satan's desire is to be elevated above God: to be worshipped and obeyed. Satan appeared to Jesus in order to tempt Him, and to win Him over to Satan's side in the battle for souls.

After forty days of fasting, Jesus was hungry. Satan knew this, and tempted Jesus to turn stones into bread.¹ Satan wanted Jesus to use His divine powers for selfish gain, but Jesus refused. Jesus quoted scripture that said He sustained himself on the words of God.

Satan led Jesus to Jerusalem and had Him stand on the highest point of he temple. Satan said "if" Jesus was the Son of God, he should prove it. Jesus should jump off the temple, and "if" He was who He said He was… angels would catch Him before He hurt even His foot.² But Jesus refused. Jesus again quoted scripture. He said, "Do not put the Lord your God to the test."

A third time, Satan tempted Jesus. Looking down on the kingdoms of the world in their splendor, Satan promised that he would give them to Jesus if Jesus would bow down and worship him. Jesus refused. Again He quoted scripture: "worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only." ³

If Jesus had given-in to Satan, He would have been Satan's servant... and we would not have a savior. Jesus set the example of using scripture to fight against the forces of evil. We must be alert to every time that we are tempted to sin. And... we must do what Jesus did: refuse to give in to temptation. Then we too will win our spiritual battles. ¹ Matthew 4:3 ² Matthew 4:6 ³ Matthew 4:10

Spiritual Warfare: Peter

Simon Peter became one of the strongest of Jesus' disciples. His brother, Andrew, introduced Peter to Jesus, and Peter left his vocation of fishing to become a follower of Jesus.

Peter wasn't always right about what he thought. And peter was often corrected by Jesus. But Peter's love for Jesus and desire to serve Jesus were strong.

Jesus called Peter a "rock" and Jesus said that He would build His church upon that rock. But... Peter was not a rock of faith after Jesus was arrested.

Why would Peter deny his true friend? Why would Peter deny his Lord? Why would Peter deny the Son of God? Had Peter just been pretending to believe all that Jesus had said? Had Peter only been thinking of the benefits he derived from following Jesus? Had Peter only loved the status he gained by being a disciple of Jesus?

It would probably be more accurate to say that Peter was more brave with Jesus at his side, than he was when Jesus was taken away. Peter wanted to live with Christ, but he didn't want to die with Christ.

Where does this thinking come from? Does it come from weakness? (as if we are unable to be brave when we do not feel Christ next to us?) Does it come from fear? (as if we are afraid of pain or death?) Does it come from doubt? (as we are saying: "I'm fairly certain that Christ is my savior... but don't make me stake my life on it.")

Christ Episcopal Church was the location of the May 5th meeting of the Cuba Council of Churches, including both pastors and laity. The treasurer reported \$899.51 in the checking account, and \$505.78 in the scholarship account. The Food Pantry has an ongoing need for nonperishable food items, in particular, Hamburger Helper, rice, instant potatoes, canned



soup, fruit, tuna and macaroni and cheese. Assistance requests included six food and four gas in March; five food and two gas in April, and one food in May as of this meeting date.

A scholarship committee of Mary Hupp, Mike Kunz and Pastor Lynn Sullivan will meet to review and discuss applicants. The \$500 award will be presented at graduation to the deserving Cuba Rushford senior.

President Nettie White asked for continued advertising through bulletins and newsletters of the various Council projects: dental/hygiene items for Cuba Rushford (collection box at the library) and Coats for Kids (winter coats and snow gear collected at Baptist Church).

Please plan to attend the annual "Songs of Faith, Hope and Inspiration" planned for June 2nd starting at 2 p.m. at the Palmer House. Donations received at the program go to support the Council Scholarship Fund. And watch for "Jail Bail" during June Dairy Days where 'prisoners' will have to pay (\$1.00/minute) to go free. In addition to paying to get out of jail, you also have the opportunity to pay to put someone **in** jail. Money raised is earmarked for the Council Scholarship Fund.

The full Council will meet again on Sunday, September 8, at the Cuba United Methodist Church.
