



Sabbath Observation "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139:14)


Most of us like to get as much out of our day as possible. We like to know that we didn't waste a single minute of those 24 hours. But that is the problem, isn't it? We are exhausted, from the planning of our day to the execution of using every second of every hour of every day.

There is a reason in Genesis that God said to rest on the seventh day. The first six days are filled with work, but we need to take time to reflect and reaffirm who we are and why we are here on that seventh day.

So, who are we and why are we here? Well, if we look to the beginning of the bible we find in the first two chapters of Genesis a very clear message, God created us and asked us to care for all that is in this world and "it was very good (Genesis 1:31)."

PROPHECY #31: The Second Coming

When the church talks about the “Second Coming”. It is talking about Jesus coming to earth for a second time. He will come (in the future) as an adult, as God’s warrior, to defeat Satan (who is God’s enemy and the doer of evil). Why is He coming again? The first time, Jesus came to earth to provide salvation. The second time He comes, He will come to rule... as King of kings. Everything will be in submission to Jesus... as Lord of lords.

The Second Coming of Jesus was predicted in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. Here are a few examples.

Old Testament:

- 1) Jesus is coming, to “judge the world in righteous.” (Psalms 96:13b)
- 2) He will, “judge the nations ... crushing the rulers of the whole earth” (Psalms 110:6)
- 3) “you will flee by my mountain valley... then the Lord my God will come” (Zechariah 14:5)

New Testament:

Signs of Second Coming: a) “Many will come in my name... deceiving many people” b) “wars and rumors of wars.” c) “nation will rise against nation.” d) “famines and earthquakes.” e) “persecution and death” of believers. f) “false prophets.” g) “increase in wickedness” h) “gospel of the kingdom will be preached.” (judgement) (Matthew 24:4-14)

- 2) At Jesus’ ascension, angels said, “Jesus will come back” (Acts 1:11)
- 3) (Jesus) “is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him.” (Revelation 1:7)

The Second Coming will begin with Jesus descending from heaven (where He went after His death). This will be seen by all the people on earth. Jesus and His angels will fight a battle against evil. (the Anti-Christ, his Associate, Satan, and earth’s evil armies) This will take place at Armageddon, near Jerusalem. Evil will be defeated and judged. (2 Thessalonians 1:6-8)


The new “Kingdom on Earth” will see Jesus ruling from the “throne of David.” And, those that He rules will all be believers in Christ. This time of peace will last 1,000 years (The Millennium). Everything will be under the authority and power of Christ. The kingdom of God will extend over the earth.



My Grandson doesn't like Dudley. Years ago he bonded with our older dog, Tucker, and they have been best friends ever since. When the boy comes to visit, the first thing they do is find each other. There is a joyful reunion, and off they go to play fetch. Later they sit on the loveseat together (one expressing affection and the other drinking it all in). When the boy is sitting at the table, Tucker is there beside him, waiting. The boy will risk a reprimand by sneaking tidbits of food to the dog. Later there will be a heart-wrenching goodbye, filled with hugs and reassurance of a timely return.

When Dudley came to be a part of our family, Tucker kept his distance. When the puppy cried at night, Tucker left the room and hoped that the intruder would go away soon. If we had to leave them along for a few minutes, we returned to find Tucker laying on a step to the second floor... and Dudley (who was too little to climb the steps) sitting at the bottom, looking up.

As Dudley matured, he took on some character traits of many small dogs. He became the boss. He had to eat before Tucker, usually from Tucker's bowl as well as his. Dudley took Tucker's toys and made Tucker wait to get them back. And, worst of all, he took over Tucker's spot on the loveseat. Dudley's master was saddened that they could not get along together. The master would try to express that both belonged to her and that both were loved. The master disciplined bad behavior with fairness. The master made time for each... equally.

The Lord Jesus is our Master. He has expressed that we belong to Him and that we are loved. (Galatians 5:24-25) The Master disciplines us with fairness to make us more like Him. (Proverbs 3:11-12) Our Master has time for each of us, and will respond immediately. (Jeremiah 33:3) Our Lord will respond to: our calls for help... our calls for our basic needs... and our calls for his presence to be felt in times of sorrow, depression, and praise.

OUR Master is perfect. He provides for our greatest needs.



PROPHECY #32: The Resurrections

The Bible tells of many resurrections. It is important to understand the definition of the word “resurrection”. We have a body and a soul. In our present time... when Believers die, our soul goes to heaven and our body goes into the ground. What does “resurrection” mean? “Resurrection” is defined as, “the time when individuals are given a resurrection body.” The resurrection body will last forever just like Jesus’ resurrection body.

Let’s look at resurrections that occurred in the past. The first one to rise and receive a resurrection body was our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 15:20-21) The second ones to be resurrected (and later to appear to others in Jerusalem) were people whose graves were opened at the moment of Jesus’ death on the cross. (Matthew 27:50-53)

Let’s look at the resurrections of people who died in the time period between Pentecost (past) and the Rapture (future). This includes most of us Believers. These persons are referred to as, “the dead in Christ.” When the Rapture comes... “the dead in Christ” will be resurrected. (They will receive a new body like Jesus’ resurrection body. (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17)


Let’s look at the resurrection of people who will die during the Great Tribulation. First there are the “Two Witnesses” who will be killed because of their testimony for the Lord Jesus. (Revelation 11:7-12) Second, there are the many “Martyred Dead” who died for their faith during the 3 1/2 years of the Great Tribulation. (Revelation 20:4)

Let’s look at the resurrection of the Old Testament saints. Righteous people (like Abraham, Moses, Samuel, David, Isaiah, Esther, Ruth, Daniel and Job) who lived before Jesus was born... had their hope in God’s promise of a future Messiah. They believed in God’s word. At the end of the Great Tribulation, they will be resurrected. (Daniel 12:2) (Isaiah 26:19)

Let’s look at the resurrection of all the wicked people who have died and gone to Hades. At the “Great White Throne Judgement”, Jesus will make the ruling that these people deserve eternal punishment. They will be thrown into the “Lake of Fire” for eternal torment. (Revelation 20:10) This is the “second death”: spiritual death.

Prophecy came true in the past.

Prophecy will come true in the future.


