### M & M PIZZA COOKIES

1 Cup margarine  
1/2 Cup sugar  
1/2 Cup packed brown sugar  
1 Egg  
1 tsp Vanilla

Cream margarine and sugars until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and vanilla. Add dry ingredients, mix well. Add M & M bits and nuts. Spread on 2 greased (12" round) Pizza pans. Leaving dough 1/2 inch fro the edge. Bake at 350\* for 15-20 minutes. Cut into wedges, like pizza.




