

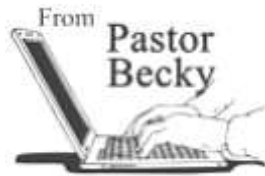

Commit Your Way to the Lord - Psalm 37:5a

September marks our third month in ministry together. Our ministry of building God's kingdom one heart and life at a time. Our ministry of sharing God's love found in Jesus Christ. Our ministry directed by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is the third month of five where I will be continuing to share my call story through Psalm 37.

The dictionary defines to commit or make a commitment as "to pledge, devote, bind or to obligate oneself to an organization, a certain course or a policy."

In our culture today, we commit ourselves almost effortlessly to professional organizations, to community groups and to service organizations. Our children are committed to scouts, dance, sports and music. None of these commitments are wrong. They become a challenge when our priorities are not in order.

Psalm 37:5a tells us, "Commit your way to the Lord."

In the beginning of my faith journey, I found this statement to be confusing and restraining. I thought, "How can I commit my way to the Lord when I really do not know the Lord, I cannot see the Lord, and I know what is best for me, myself and I." My professional journey was mapped out. The corporate ladder was before me. Why would I commit my way to the Lord?

Then I started to hear sermons about a faithful person's life priorities. We were asked as a group to share the important areas in our lives and place them in a pie chart. Some of the areas were family/friends, dating/marriage, health, recreation/fun, career/job/profession/work, relationships, finances, personal development, volunteering and faith/spiritual growth.

Next, we were asked "Where is God in this mix of the important areas in our lives?" So, I placed God in a slice of the pie. A neat, small slice of the pie. A neat, **extremely small** slice of the pie.

More sermons on a faithful person's life priority list. UGH! This faith journey was not going to be easy. Ever so slowly I began to understand that each slice of the pie was okay **IF** God was at the center of the pie.

Psalm 37:5a tells us, "Commit your way to the Lord."

Over the years, "Commit your way to the Lord," has transformed my life into daily reading of the scriptures, prayer, weekly attendance at church for worship (yes weekly), seeking God's best, seeing others as beloved children of God, sharing the love of God found in Jesus by building relationships, being involved in the community and continuing with the hobbies that I love (walks with "The Boys," knitting, reading and napping).

Today, when I have conversations about faith and commitment, I often hear excuses.

According to a Pew Research Center survey, the top reasons respondents gave for skipping regular religious services included:

- They practice their faith in "other ways." (37%)
- They are not believers. (28%)
- No reason is "very important." (26%)
- They haven't found a house of worship they like. (23%)
- They don't like the sermons. (18%)
- They don't feel welcome. (14%)
- They don't have the time. (12%)
- Poor health or mobility. (9%)
- No house of worship in their area. (7%)

I find the above statistics disheartening as well as challenging. In a world in need of God's love and grace, forgiveness and the hope we have in Jesus, how can we as the Cornerstone District commit or recommit our work together to begin to change what the statistics are telling us?

I hate to say this... but sometimes Dudley is bossy. He is bossy with dogs that come to visit, with cats that walk through the yard, with the UPS man, and even with Tucker. Tucker, our small collie, had lived in our home as the only dog, until Dudley arrived.

Dudley was not bossy as a puppy. He enjoyed Tucker's company and playing with Tucker's toys. Tucker put up with Dudley's energy and his crying the first few nights. If Tucker needed a break from Dudley, he would climb about four steps up on the stairway. Dudley was unable to climb steps for weeks.,

But now Dudley is grown up. He has put himself in charge of: 1) eating first, (out of either dog dish), 2) in charge of leading the direction of the walks that the three of us take, and 3) in charge of the number of treats that he gets as compared to Tucker.

One day when Tucker and Dudley each got three small treats, Dudley gobbled his down and confronted Tucker (who had only eaten one so far.) Dudley stared at Tucker... and, without warning, barked so loud, that I was jolted from doing what I was doing. What caused that?

Tucker slowly got up and walked away... and Dudley ran over and quickly ate Tucker's treats.

Dudley had coveted Tucker's treats, and he had stolen them from Tucker. Why? Maybe it was a survival instinct. Maybe Dudley learned that he could get his own way by being loud and threatening.

Evidently Dudley did not know that his master would not be pleased.

God made the rules clear to mankind. People were not to covet things that others had, and they were not to steal what belonged to others. (Exodus 20) God's Word also teaches mankind about anger. Tucker did not get angry with Dudley. He walked away.

The Bible says that if we are angry, we should not retaliate, because that is sin. (Psalm 4:4) The Bible also says that if we are angry with someone, we should resolve it quickly (before we go to bed) or else the anger will fester. (Ephesians 4:26)

When Jesus lived on earth, on occasion, he became angry. But, the anger of Jesus was righteous anger. He hated all forms of sin. (Matthew 23:13-14) He hated the unfairness in man's judging others. (John 8:3-7) He hated the conceit of the religious leaders. (Matthew 23:13) He hated that people were buying and selling merchandise in the temple. (John 2:16) He hated Satan who tried to snatch mankind away from God. (Matthew 16:23)

Dudley's master doesn't like him being bossy, but she loves who he is. Jesus, our Master, doesn't like our sinful nature, but loves who we are. We are created in the image of God. (Genesis 1:27) Do we speak and act in a godly manner?
