



Late in the afternoon the twelve disciples came to him and said, "Send the crowds away to the nearby villages and farms, so they can find food and lodging for the night. There is nothing to eat here in this remote place." But Jesus said, "You feed them." Luke 9:12-13

You Feed Them

I love the story in Luke 9 about Jesus feeding the 5,000. As it gets late and the multitude gets hungry, we see the disciples show extreme concern for the people who were following Jesus. They wanted to see the people fed, sheltered, and cared for. They knew Jesus had the answer for what the people needed. He had the influence and the authority to send them away to go home, eat, and rest. But Jesus did not send the people away. He looked at His disciples and responded the same way that He does today, "You feed them."

We have been given unique gifts, talents, and personalities that He can use to speak into the lives of those around us who are hurting. All we have to do is obey.

Jesus instructed the disciples to gather together what they could find and to bring it to Him. Taking what they had, He blessed it and fed the multitude.

What do you have? What gifts or talents do you have to bring to Jesus? Be bold, present them to Him, and allow Him to use them to feed those around you who are hurting. Maybe you feel called to the nations or to the single mom down the street. Let's not be a people who witness the hurting around us hoping someone will act. Let us go boldly before the Father and ask Him to send us. We "freely received," now it is time for us to "freely give" (Matthew 10:5-8). Who is God calling you to feed today?

CHEESE WAFERS

- 1 cup butter, softened (no substitutes)
- 3/4 # Sharp or XS cheddar, grated
- 2 cups flour
- 2 tsp sugar
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp cayenne or red pepper
- 2 cups Rice Krispies
- Pecan halves



Cream butter & cheese. Add flour, sugar, salt and pepper. Mix with hands and add cereal. Form into 1" ball, flatten with fork to 1/4". Put pecan half on each. Bake 400° for 15 minutes.

ADULT SUNDAY BIBLE STUDIES with Cheryl



During the month of September, the adult class has addressed the question, “do animals go to heaven?” We have used a book by Steven Woodward as food for thought.

The main debate centers around the question of whether or not animals have a soul like humans do. The idea is, that if animals do not have a soul... then they cannot go to heaven. Mr. Woodward bases his strong belief (that animals will be in heaven) upon the visions he has seen of his dogs that have died.

Our class read the dictionary definitions of “soul” and “spirit”... and then went right to the Bible. The creation account in the book of Genesis says that after God made man, He breathed into him the “breath of life.” (Genesis 2:7) Breath and animation are equated with the word “spirit”. Genesis 1:30 says that God gave green plants for food to “everything that has the breath of life in it.” Since animals ate plants after creation... it follows that animals had the “breath of life” in them.

The book of Genesis also tells us that God talked to the animals (and Adam and Eve) and told them to, be fruitful and multiply” (Genesis 1:22) Obviously, if God talked to the animals, then He knew the animals could hear Him, and obey Him.

The word “soul” seems to have more relevance to life after death. The dictionary says that the “soul” is considered to be, “a distinct entity separate from the body”. Hence, it can separate from the body at death. So, do animals have a soul?

1. In the book of Genesis (1:22) it says that God blessed the animals. “Bless” means, “to bestow some benefit upon.” What was that benefit?
2. In the book of Job (12:10) it says, “The soul of EVERY living thing is in the Lord’s hand.” This seems to say that EVERY living thing has a soul.
3. In the book of Psalm (36:6) it says, “Lord, thou preserveth man and beast.” This seems to say that God keeps animals in existence.
4. Animals were created to praise God. (Psalm 150:6) (Revelation 5:13) If all creation (animals too) was pronounced to be “good” by God (Genesis 1:31), and if animals (and other creatures) praise God... Why wouldn’t God want them in heaven?

Let’s make sure we get to heaven, to find out.

Recently I noticed that Dudley and Tucker were not getting along. Dudley had raised his voice at Tucker... and Tucker had turned and walked away. This occurred at their supper time. Another time (when beginning an evening walk), they had darted out of the house at full speed, and gotten their leashes entwined up to the neck. Dudley (thinking that Tucker was making his life difficult) jumped at Tucker's face. Tucker, who was not pleased, snapped at Dudley. It all happened within a few seconds. Fortunately, their master intervened... separating the two, calming them, and giving them a chance to start over. As they walked with their master, Dudley and Tucker's relationship was restored and the positive, loving parts of their personalities could be seen again.

We are God's creatures created in His image. We have intelligence, and can usually find solutions to problems, except in personal situations when we feel unloved or disrespected. These situations bring out the worst in us. Some of us (like Dudley) may raise our voice, or confront the offender. Some of us (like Tucker) may walk away from conflict, or get angry when someone is in our face. Has our Master stopped walking with us? Or, have WE stopped walking with Him?

Jesus is our Master He modeled love that met people's needs. He comforted those who were hurting -- both physically and emotionally. He showed us how we should treat others... even when they have hurt us. Jesus did not say to wait until that person apologizes first. He said, "forgive them, for they don't know what they are doing."

When we truly forgive, love is restored. Forgiveness changes how we feel and act toward those who have hurt us. Dudley and Tucker enjoyed their walk after their master helped them. We should ask our Master to help us. (Colossians 3:13) (Ephesians 4:32) (Matthew 6:14) (Mark 11:25)


PRISM

George Washington was the first to declare Thanksgiving a holiday, but it was on a year-to-year basis, so presidents had to re-declare it every year, according to The Washington Post. Jefferson was so adamantly against Thanksgiving that he refused to declare it a holiday during his presidency, and many say that he called the holiday "the most ridiculous idea ever conceived."

Most historians agree that Jefferson really refused to declare the holiday because he fervently believed in the separation of church and state and thought that the day of "prayer" violated the First Amendment.

It wasn't until 1863, when Abraham Lincoln proclaimed Thanksgiving a federal holiday, that it was officially scheduled to fall on the fourth Thursday of every November.
